Petition Requesting Amendments to Junction Layout Carnaryon Road and Victoria Avenue

A Part 1 Public Agenda Item

1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To advise Members of a petition received from residents with 73 signatories of Tunbridge Road and Penhurst Avenue to amend the current junction layout at Carnarvon Road and Victoria Avenue to accommodate a right turn manoeuvre into Victoria Avenue from Carnarvon Road.

2. Recommendation

That the Traffic & Parking Working Party and Cabinet Committee:

- b) Note that investigations are being undertaken with regard to the existing manoeuvres and traffic flows at this location as part of development potential on the west side of Victoria Avenue.

3. Background

- 3.1 The currently empty commercial premises on the west side of Victoria Avenue are subject to negotiations related to potential development. Victoria Avenue has been the subject of a City Deal and Local Growth Funding and it is also included in the Southend Central Area Action Plan (SCAAP) which is planning he future of this and other areas within the town centre.
- 3.2 It is likely that developments will increase and affect traffic movements and as such, investigations are currently being undertaken to assess the likely impact and explore the potential of amendments to the existing junction layout in order to accommodate additional movements.
