## Health scrutiny at Southend

- 1. Function sits with People Scrutiny Committee. Fulfils the Council's responsibilities under 'The Local Authority (Public Health, Health and Wellbeing Boards and Health Scrutiny) Regulations 2013' to have health scrutiny provision.
- 2. Detailed Guidance published on 27<sup>th</sup> June 2014 by Department of Health.
- 3. Have power to:
  - review & scrutinise matters relating to planning, provision & operation of health service in the area;
  - require information to be provided;
  - require attendance at meeting;
  - make reports & recommendations & expect response;
  - set up Joint committees with other Upper tier Local Authorities;
  - refer substantial reconfiguration proposals to Secretary of State (on certain grounds).
- 4. Complimentary role to healthwatch and Healthwatch Manager is a non-voting co-opted member on the Scrutiny Committee.
- 5. Main changes arising from new legislation:
  - Local Authorities within scope of legislation "relevant health service providers" (Regulation 20 provides a definition)
  - Need mechanism in place to deal with referrals by healthwatch (Regulation 21) (covered in Scrutiny/Healthwatch protocol)
  - Need mechanism in place to respond to consultations and how members of Joint Committee will be appointed (covered in the Council's constitution)
  - Health scrutiny function conferred on Council delegated to People Scrutiny (Regulation 28)
  - Mandatory Joint Committees with other areas (when considering substantial reconfiguration proposals) – can choose whether to delegate power of referral to mandatory Joint Committee (Regulation 30)
  - Clarification on what information is needed in any referral to Secretary of State (Regulation 22)
- 6. Protocols being reviewed to check against this Guidance.
- 7. Programme of support for 14/15 to be delivered by Centre for Public Scrutiny (CfPS) <a href="www.cfps.org.uk">www.cfps.org.uk</a>. Jointed funded by Department of Health, Public Health England and NHS England will focus on service reconfiguration, integrated commissioning and reducing health inequalities.
