3. Updates

- 3.1 <u>Essex Stroke Review</u> attached at <u>Appendix 1</u> is a statement of current position for members on this matter.
- 3.2 <u>Use of the pupil premium</u> at the meeting on 28th January 2014 (Minute 709 refers), the Council's Head of Learning was asked to bring a report to Scrutiny on the use of the pupil premium in Southend schools. The Committee is asked to note that the report will be brought to the next scheduled meeting of the Committee.

There was an introductory session from Andrew Pike, NHS England Area Director on the new health landscape and current and emerging issues, followed by presentations from the 5 'Essex' CCG's on the challenges and issues facing them.
