Pregnancy & 1st year of life

2,200 live births (1% pop)

- Smoking at time of delivery 10.9%, lower than England average (2013-14)
- Low birth weight 6.8% (2013), similar to England rate
- Breastfeeding initiation 73% with 36.7% breastfeeding at 6-8 weeks, which is lower than the England average (2012-
- Access to antenatal care within 12 weeks of pregnancy
- Infant mortality 3.7 per 1,000 live births (20011-13) which is similar to England Average

Children & Young People (1-24)

49,000 children & young people (28% pop)

- Child Poverty (under 16 years) 21.7% higher than the England average
- 20.1% of children aged 5 years have one or more decayed, missing or filled teeth (2011/12), significantly better than England average
- Obesity (2013/14): 9% of children in Reception and 17.9% of children in Year 6 are obese- both increased from previous year, similar to England average
- 61.6% children achieve a good level of development at the end of Reception similar to England
- Looked after children: 229 (31st May 2015). Rate 60.5 per 10,000 similar to England (60 per 10,000). Uptake of immunisations in looked after children is worse than England average
- Children in Need 471 (31 May 2015) 124.4 per 10,000 lower than the national average (346.4 per 10,000)
- The number of children with a Child Protection Plan is 193 (31 May 2015) which is a rate of 51 per 10.000. The rate of CPP for 2013/14 nationally
- The FSM gap at KS2 was -21 percentage points in 2014, compared to -18 points national
- The FSM gap at KS4 was -44 percentage points in 2014, compared to -27 points nationally

- Almost two thirds of adults (63.8%) are overweight or obese
- 1 in 4 are clinically obese
- 34.5% of adults participate in sport at least once a week
- 28% of adults do less than 30 minutes of physical activity per week
- The number of hospital stays for alcohol related harm is similar to the national average
- The prevalence of opiate and/or crack use is higher than the national average

Transport
