1. Purpose of Report

To seek Members agreement to implement an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order in Pantile Avenue to prohibit parking on the north side from 8am to 8pm Monday to Saturday and prohibit parking on the grass verge on the south side 24 hours daily.

2. Recommendation

That Members agree to implement the Experimental Order funded by the Primary Care Trust.

3. Background

- **3.1** Members may be aware of a new health centre located in Pantile Avenue. The facility is available for use by any South East Essex residents and is operational for much of the day and evening. Such flexible operation is likely to attract patients from outside the immediate area and while public transport offers a service to the location, it is likely that patients may travel to the facility by car. Limited parking is available however there are concerns that additional parking may create difficulties for the public transport vehicles to negotiate the road.
- **3.2** An additional concern is that the prohibition of parking may lead to parking on the wide grass verge directly opposite the site. At present there is no mechanism available to enforce such parking therefore a Traffic Regulation Order and appropriate signing will be required.

4. Other Options

Do nothing. This option is likely to lead to access problems for the public transport vehicles and may lead to further damage to grass verges.

To deter parking that is likely to impede public transport vehicle flow and damage grass verges
