Some properties rely on parking in the road (c). Some properties have more vehicles than can be accommodated off street (d). Will move parking elsewhere not resolve the issue (e). Neighbours resolve any problems between themselves Part time prohibitions affect residents and do not resolve problems</p>	See below
2	Rosary Gardens	<p>Support received from 8 directly affected properties in the road stating</p> <p>(a). Road not wide enough for parking and drivers resort to parking on verge (b). Will resolve the often dangerous parking Parking particularly at entrance is becoming a problem</p>	The level of support does outweigh the objections however there is concern that these restrictions, while designed to resolve all day parking by local workers, do have an adverse impact on residents it is suggested the restriction be placed in the east west section of the close only (see plan) leaving the areas outside of the properties available for parking.
3	Westbourne Grove and Southbourne Grove	<p>Objections received – 1 from a directly affected resident and 3 from outside the directly affected road.</p> <p>(a). If not implemented it may help parking problems in nearby roads (Carlton Avenue) (b). Inconvenient to residents (c). Compound problems in existence around hospital (d). Prevents parking for post office (in adjacent road) Suggest limited waiting provided</p>	See below
4	Westbourne Grove and Southbourne Grove	<p>Support received from 10 directly affected residents</p> <p>(a). Restriction improves safety (b). Emergency vehicles able to get through easily (c). Works well for residents</p>	The restriction has been in place for several years and has successfully deterred all day parking. Proposals to implement a parking scheme in the hospital area should resolve the displaced parking issue and will also provide a limited waiting parking area for post office customers directly outside the post office. In the majority residents appear content with restrictions and it is recommended they be retained.
