3.1 Members agreed to advertise Traffic Regulation Orders to revoke Loading Bays on the north side of the square and provide a Loading Bay on the south side of the square. In addition, the layout of the existing parking bays was amended to incorporate 5 additional parking bays.

3.2 Following advertisement of the Order an objection has been received which is summarised in Appendix 1 of the report and copies of the comment received have been available for inspection in the Members room.
