Objections to Notice Proposed Zebra Crossing in Vicinity of St. Michael's Preparatory School, Hadleigh Road and Prince Avenue Primary School, Hornby Avenue

1. Purpose of Report

For the Traffic and Parking Working Party and Cabinet Committee to consider representations to an advertised Notice, under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, Section 23 and make an appropriate decision.

3. Background

Objections to Notice Proposed Zebra Crossing in Vicinity of St Michael's Preparatory School Hadleigh Road Agenda Item No.

- 3.1 Members agreed to advertise a Notice to introduce a zebra pedestrian crossing in Hadleigh Road located approximately 11 metres south-east of the south-east kerb-line of Vernon Road and in Hornby Avenue approximately 34 metres east of the east kerb line of Hornby Avenue.
- 3.2 Following advertisement of the proposals, one representation has been received.
- 3.3 A summary of the representation can be found in Appendix 1 with officer comments where it may be possible to mitigate the proposal in response to respondee objections.
