A Part 1 Public Agenda Item

1. Purpose of Report

For the Traffic and Parking Working Party and Cabinet Committee to consider objections to recently advertised proposals and make an appropriate decision.

 - 2.2.3 Take no further action

In the event of either 2.2.1 or 2.2.2 being agreed to authorise the implementation of the scheme as advertised, or amend to reduce the impact, as appropriate.

3. Background

3.1 Some roads within the borough are subject to a parking restriction which alternates between the sides of the road each month. These type of restrictions can create confusion and some residents have petitioned through the local press for changes.

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- 3.2 While advertising these particular roads it was felt appropriate to also consult residents in all affected streets to assess the popularity of this style of restriction and suggest alternatives.
- 3.3 The statutory advertisement process commenced in March 2011 and the comments received in the appendices to this report resulted.

5. Reasons for Recommendations

To amend restrictions to suit the majority of residents.
