1. Purpose of Report

For the Traffic and Parking Working Party and Cabinet Committee to consider objections to a Traffic Regulation Order.

3. Background

- 3.1 Issues relating to all day parking by local staff and car traders in London Road by Leigh Cemetery were highlighted by a local business as customers were not able to park nearby. Much of the commercial areas of London Road are subject to a limited waiting restriction which allows parking for 1 hour. This type of restriction ensures a turnover of customers for the local businesses.
- 3.2 Members agreed to advertise a limited waiting restriction to overcome this issue.

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- Following advertisement of the restriction, an objection has been received from a nearby business.
- 3.4 Support for the restriction and the suggestion of proposing similar restrictions west of this area has also been received from a Leigh Town Councillor.
- 3.5 The details of the objection are detailed in Appendix 1 to this report.
