3. Background

- 3.1 Discussions with the Southend Licensed Taxi Drivers Association (SLTDA) regarding improvements to Taxi Ranks throughout the borough have been ongoing.
- 3.2 The provision of an additional rank within the High Street is proposed and to facilitate the progression of the proposals, minor amendments to the existing

waiting and loading restrictions are required. The SLTDA are supportive of this proposal.

Following advertisement of the amendment, an objection has been received from the Secretary of the Hackney Carriage Association; the details of the objection are shown below.

High Street Street Picture 1 Remove waiting and loading restrictions to facilitate additional taxi rank For a considerable time, stopping in the High Street has not been possible for safety and prevention of obstructions. No demand for extra ranks — three nearby ranks in this area are under used the majority of the time. Pedestrian views of oncoming traffic will be obstructed as most taxis are higher vehicles (disable access). Waste of tax payers money for a new rank when clearly evident nearby ranks not effectively used. Will prevent any other vehicles stopping to drop off or collect their customers from the east side of the road as this will effectively block the road.	nis ce to nd sed
