- (c) Waiting and loading restrictions may not be introduced in isolated residential streets unless there are pedestrian and traffic safety issues demonstrated through the accident statistics (as in (b) above).
- (d) Where high traffic volume and flow is affected by parked vehicles.
- (e) at a junction (agreed Jan 13)

This is a fairly small area and displacement would occur into the roads north of the area (east of Queensway), complaints are received from these roads as to town centre parking and also parking issues caused by workers at Lloyds Building in Southchurch Avenue. Recommend that any scheme should also include the roads north of this area between Queensway and Southchurch Avenue and ward councillors ascertain extend of support in the area.
