1. Purpose of Report

For Members to agree priorities for the projects set out in Appendix 1 to this report.

2. Recommendation

- 2.1.1 That the Working Party and Cabinet Committee consider the projects listed in Appendix 1 to this report and prioritise the works accordingly, and that the Cabinet Committee agree :
 - a) The priority for each of the project in Appendix
 - b) To authorises the advertisement of requisite Traffic Regulation Orders for the agreed projects; and,
 - c) That in the event of there being no objections to the proposals, the Traffic Regulation Order be confirmed; and,
 - d) That any locations subject to unresolved objections will be referred to the Committee for consideration.

Background

- 3.1 The parking and traffic management work area generally requires a significant level of officer time to undertake the investigatory works, design and consultation processes in order to progress projects. In addition, the financial resources for such works are limited and need to be prioritised to ensure best value. Given the extent of resources it is not possible to undertake all requested projects.
- 3.2 It needs to be noted that the projects listed are in addition to minor works ongoing throughout the year such as investigating reports/complaints, investigation and analysis of accidents and assessment of required intervention,

general maintenance of signs and lines and investigation of Members requests. Members' guidance is sought in prioritising the current works.

4. Other Options

4.2 The extent of traffic, parking and road safety issues across the borough vary and are influenced by many factors and the options for each issue are different and need to be dealt with in a priority order. Members' input through "Members' requests" and through a prioritisation process is vital to ensure our focus is targeted at the most important areas.
