1. Purpose of Report

To inform members of the current position with regard to the performance of all schools, including those schools causing concern, and to update on known Academy developments.

2. Recommendation

3. Update

Ofsted Inspections

Milton Hall Primary School received a full inspection 3rd and 4th October 2018 and the report which judged the school as being a strong Good was published 6th November 2018.

West Leigh Infants were subject to a short inspection on 18 October 2018. The visit was the first short inspection carried out since the school was judged to be good in October 2014. The report found that the school continues to be good.

Academy conversions

There have been no further Academy conversions since the last People Scrutiny Committee.

Following the judgement by OFSTED of inadequate for Cecil Jones in November 2017, the Regional Schools Commissioner has now rebrokered the school from LEGRA to Loxford Multi Academy Trust. Following due diligence, the school will start to move to the new trust in January, and formally move in March 2019.
