LICENSING ACT 2003

A Part I Public Agenda Item

1. Purpose of Report

- 1.1 This report considers an application by Masala Kitchen UK Ltd to transfer the Premises Licence.
- 2. Recommendation
- 2.1 That the Sub-Committee determines the application.
- 3. Background
- 3.1 The premises comprise an established restaurant located in London Road between Dawlish Drive and Leigh Hall Road.
- 4. The Review Application
- 4.1 Details of the application which are to be determined by the Sub-Committee can be briefly summarised as follows:
 - a) To transfer the Premises Licence

5. Application Procedure

- 5.1 Applicants for this type of application are required by law to send a copy of their application The Police who are the only party permitted to object.
- 5.2 A representation has been made by Essex Police,
- 5.3 A copy of the representation has been provided to the Sub-Committee Members. In accordance with the legislation, all parties have been invited to attend the hearing.

6. Matter for Consideration

6.1 Formal objections having been made and not withdrawn or resolved, the Licensing Authority is obliged to hold a hearing to consider them. Further, having regard to such representations, the Authority is required to take steps (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

Thus, in the case of the transfer, the Authority may:

- a) Grant the transfer of the licence, subject to the existing conditions;
- b) Refuse the application.
- 6.2 The Licensing Act 2003 requires that the Licensing Authority must carry out its functions under the Act with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives. These are:
 - a) The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - b) Public safety;
 - c) The prevention of public nuisance; and
 - d) The protection of children from harm.

However in the case of a contested transfer application the Licensing Authority may only consider representations in respect of the Crime Prevention objective

- 6.3 In carrying out its licensing functions, the Licensing Authority must also have regard to:
 - Its Licensing Statement, and
 - 2. The guidance issued by the Secretary of State.
- 6.4 The Licensing Authority has, in accordance with the requirements of the Act, prepared and published a Statement of Licensing Policy, following formal consultation. Copies of this document, together with the statutory guidance, have been made available to all Licensing Committee Members.

7. Existing Licensing Controls

- 7.1 The premises have the benefit of a Premises Licence, which permits the following licensable activities:
 - a) The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
 - b) The provision of late night refreshment.
 - c) The provision of regulated entertainment comprising recorded music.
- 7.3 The permitted hours for licensable activities are shown on the Premises Licence, which are:



4. The Application

- 4.1 The application was given to the Licensing Authority on 11th August 2020 and is for the variation of a premises licence to specify a new Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 4.2 The Designated Premises Supervisor's role is that they are the person nominated on a premises licence as the person with responsibility for the sale of alcohol.
- 4.3 The grounds for the application are that the premises is undermining the licensing objective of the prevention of crime and disorder.
- 4.4 Full details are provided within the application form, which has been copied to Sub-Committee Members.


