3 Background

- 3.1 Health in All Policies (HiAP) is a collaborative approach to improving the health and wellbeing of all people by encompassing health, equity, and sustainability considerations into decision-making across sectors and policy areas.
- 3.2 The approach recognises that our greatest health challenges, such as chronic ill-health, climate change, health inequities between and within communities, and increasing health and care costs, are highly complex and influenced by policies and interventions across all sectors. Used alongside the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment, it can provide more impetus to the drive in developing our collaboration, further integration of local services and improving the health and wellbeing of our residents.
