The WSOA highlighted the need for a meaningful multi-agency approach to meeting children and young people's academic, social, health and care needs through robust EHCPs. In response, a quality assurance review is underway to embed robust and outcomes based processes are incorporated all aspects of the planning and publication of EHCPs.

A new Health Assurance Group has been established, initially mapping the current process at each stage i.e. Section 23 notifications, Early Warning notifications, EHCP Contributions and Annual Reviews. An EHCP Health Handbook has been developed, and almost at completion stage. This ensures a consistent approach, championing personalisation and utilising current and relevant information together with goal based outcomes.

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Once ready, this will be published both internally and externally for transparency including on the Local Offer.

Focus will now be moved to quality assurance in each of the providers, and embedding an audit process and how this feeds back to providers.

The Balance System project takes a whole system approach to delivery of effective, high quality therapies. Utilising all available resources i.e. early years settings, schools, community health providers, voluntary sector etc., the balance system aims to embed universal, targeted and specialist approaches to ensure early identification of need and the right support at the right time and in the right place.

The Multi-school's council are involved to lead on young people's engagement. The Southend SEND Independent Forum (SSIF) and SEN Team Leader have been actively attending regular meetings for this work. The work is now moving on to school engagement across Heads, SENCOs and Teachers. A

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communication has gone out via key distribution links in Southend with the aim of consulting with as many stakeholders as possible. Stakeholder sessions are currently taking place. The early sharing of the SLT process has been scheduled for 24th June to provide further information about what is coming out of this piece of work and whether further data collation is required.
