## **Update on Key Issues**

There is work going on to implement new Marine Protection Areas (MPA's) around the sea areas off the River Blackwater, Crouch, Roach and Colne to protect the Native Oyster stock part of the MCZ area. Hythe Bay in Kent dealt with as an MPA, and off the Dungeness, Romney Marsh and Rye Bay an extension to the SPA extension to protect Tern foraging grounds.

Cockle Surveys will commence again in spring, and provided the High "Spat fall" survives over the winter, the Total Allowable Catch (TAC) may be increased for 2017. The Whelk permit byelaw is being reviewed to ensure the technical specifications are still right, this needs to be reviewed every three years. More research is being undertaken to try and increase the Whelk population/Fishery.

There are new E.U. Bass management measures coming into force this year and quotas and TAC's will all be reviewed. Rod and line fishing will have measures against them removing more than 10 fish a month, this will affect charter boats, pier and shore fishing and anyone caught overfishing could be prosecuted.

Measures are being looked to manage the Thornback Wray more efficiently as whole no take areas are preventing the taking of Wray's by commercial fishermen whilst rod and line anglers are still removing stock.
